



Commissaire Code of Conduct

Commissaires have the responsibility to:

- Ensure that the competitors and other license holders act within the letter and intent of the rules and regulations governing the sport as interpreted by the UCI, CCA, and Cycling BC, within the context of the competitions under their supervision.
- Help encourage and instill an attitude of determination and drive for competitive excellence while promoting a spirit of good sportsmanship.
- Recognize that commissaires hold a position of authority over athletes and that this relationship must be managed in a positive and professional manner for the benefit of the all involved.

As a result, Commissaires shall:

- Maintain or enhance the dignity and self-esteem of athletes, organizers, coaches, managers and other officials by:
 - demonstrating respect to individuals regardless of gender, ethnic or racial origin, sexual orientation, age, marital status, religion, political belief, disability or economic status;
 - refraining from public criticism of athletes, coaches, team managers, other commissaires, or any sport governing body;
 - consistently demonstrating the spirit of sports leadership and officiating.
- Abstain from the use of alcohol and tobacco while officiating at events
- Refrain from the use of profane, insulting, harassing or otherwise offensive language
- Communicate about the sport of Cycling in a moderate and constructive manner
- Adhere to Cycling BC's Policies and Procedures
- Maintain a current knowledge of the applicable UCI and CCA regulations, Cycling BC policy, and practical officiating techniques for the disciplines in which they officiate
- Accept responsibility for their actions

I have read and understood the above statements and agree to conduct myself in a manner that abides by the standards established in the Code of Conduct, Cycling BC Policy, and by the UCI and CCA regulations.
