JOB SUMMARY

The iRide School Head Instructor is responsible for the delivery of iRide programs offered by Cycling BC.

WORKING RELATIONSHIPS

The iRide School Head Instructor works with their fellow iRide instructors on-site and reports to the iRide Provincial Manager for additional guidance and support.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

On-Site:

- Instruction of school programs
- Conduct bike safety and helmet checks prior to all sessions

Equipment:

- Reporting and managing any mechanical issues with the iRide rental bikes
- Safe transport of iRide Trailer/Sprinter Van or other CBC vehicles

Administrative Tasks:

- Participate in a weekly conference call with other iRide Instructors and the iRide Manager
- Submit a monthly 1-2 paragraph self-reflection to help the iRide Manager identify areas for possible guidance and support.
