Title: iRide School Instructor

JOB SUMMARY

The iRide School Instructor is responsible for the delivery of iRide programs offered by Cycling BC.

WORKING RELATIONSHIPS

The iRide Instructor works with their fellow iRide instructors on-site and reports to the iRide Provincial Manager for additional guidance and support.

KEY ACCOUNTABILITIES

On-Site:

- Instruction of school programs
- Conduct bike safety and helmet checks prior to all sessions

Equipment:

- Reporting any mechanical issues with the iRide rental bikes
- Loading & unloading bike trailer and/or sprinter van

Administrative Tasks:

- Participate in a weekly conference call with other iRide Instructors and the iRide Manager
- Submit a monthly 1-2 paragraph self-reflection to help the iRide Manager identify areas for possible guidance and support.

COMMITMENT

COMPENSATION

Training and workday compensation is \$15 per hour.

A TYPICAL WORKDAY: Meet at bike storage location (home/business) or at the event location. Arrive at the location, meet school admin, unload bikes and setup courses. Instruct 4-6 classes each day. Enjoy lunch in the staff room!
