Cycling BC – Road Commissaire Driver Briefing Checklist Rev. 2014-04-21 ☐ Introduce yourself ☐ Find out if the driver has ever driven in a race before, or if he/she has experience as a rider ☐ Let the driver know that they can ask you questions at any time ☐ Explain in general the role of the Commissaire position you are performing (e.g. comm. 1 or comm. 2) • Explain the correct distance to maintain from the riders (flat / climbs / descents) • Explain the usual vehicle movements for the position (e.g. comm. 1: follow the bunch, drop individual riders / groups of riders no longer in contention) o Pass on the left hand side of riders (riders to the right of the car) o Tap the horn lightly when passing riders or other cars o Help call numbers if requested (e.g. get the numbers of the riders in a group that are about to be dropped) Pay attention at all times! ☐ Before starting the race: Go to the bathroom o Ensure that there is enough gas Set trip odometer to zero o Turn on headlights ☐ If you are the PCP, brief the neutral service drivers. Same basic information as above, but also:

- o Explain the "wheel-in" / "wheel-out" system (only riders who provide a set of wheels can take a set of wheels)
- o If any neutral wheels are provided by the organizer, point out that anyone can benefit from those
- o Only provide service on the right hand side of the road
- Report anything "unusual" (e.g. riders departing from the course, injuries, etc.). Note the numbers of the riders involved, as well as the odometer reading into the race.
