Cycling BC is seeking applications for staff interested in serving on the staff of British Columbia's 2022 Canada Summer Games **ROAD** Cycling team. The Cycling portion of the Games is currently scheduled to take place August 5th - 21st, with the road portion taking place in week 2 from August 15-21st.

The road cycling staff will consist of a coach, mechanic and manager. Pre-travel expenses, including transport to the airport will be reviewed on a case-by-case basis. All staff selections are subject to change.

All Staff must:

- Be current members of Cycling BC at the time of nomination and maintain their memberships through 2022
- Be publicly supportive of Cycling BC policies and programmes
- Attend all staff meetings, team camps, selection meets and the 2022 Games
- Be willing to work cooperatively with other members of the Team Staff
- Take on additional duties as requested by Cycling BC where required
- Assist with supervision and management of the Team on and off the competition venue
- Conduct themselves appropriately as representatives of Cycling BC and the province of BC
- Have a strong commitment to the team aspect of the competition
- Uphold team expectations and report any problems to Cycling BC
- Be willing to undergo a screening process, including police checks, as requested

The Coach will:

- Be fully certified at NCCP Competition Development in Cycling. Coaches who have Introduction to Competition certification, but who have not completed Competition Development are encouraged to apply with the understanding that they must have completed Competition Development prior to July 2022.
- Be experienced at the appropriate level and actively coaching in the same event in which he/she is applying to coach
- Be responsible for preparing team athletes in the event for which he/she was chosen to achieve the best possible result
- Be knowledgeable of the physical condition of athlete team members leading up to and during the Games and be ready to make recommendations for changes in entries as required
- Be aware of rules, facilities and equipment in the event group area and use this knowledge to assist athletes to achieve best possible results
- Submit, following the Games, a report covering his/her area of responsibility

The Mechanic will:

- Be responsible for the maintenance of each athlete's bike in preparation for each day of training or racing.
- Be responsible for assisting athletes with their bike build(s)
- Have a fully stocked tool box with all tools required to perform maintenance on MTB &/or Road/TT bikes
- Be responsible for the loading of bikes into the events equipment vehicle for each training and race day

- Provide a recommended spare part list to the team manager to share with selected athletes and staff
- Report equipment concerns to the manager and coach

Note: Full job descriptions and a code of conduct will be available to selected staff at a later date.

Coaches: please apply by sending a resume, to include Cycling BC membership number, NCCP certification level, experience (including team staff appointments), athletes coached, event group you wish to be considered for, references (possibly an endorsement from the club) and any other information that would support your application.

Mechanics: please apply by sending a resume to Cycling BC and please include references.
