Affiliating with Cycling BC offers clubs, teams, and businesses access to a variety of services and support, such as insurance, training & educational opportunities, and eligibility for grants and funding options.

Clubs: In 2025, Cycling BC supported clubs through club services such as Ride Leader Training, insurance, education, and access to grants & funding opportunities through viaSport BC and Sport Canada.

Teams: Teams serve as the pulse of the competitive racing community in BC, uniting riders who train and compete together under a shared banner. Much like clubs, Cycling BC provides support to teams through insurance, education, and access to grants and funding opportunities from viaSport BC and Sport Canada.

Businesses: In 2025, we redefined the Business affiliation type to be exclusively for event organizers, providing them with event sanctioning services, insurance, grant opportunities, and collaboration on risk management so events meet appropriate safety and fairness standards.

The Canada Summer Games represented a major highlight of the high-performance program in 2025. Cycling BC played an integral role in the preparation, selection, and support of Team BC cyclists competing in road and mountain bike disciplines. The team brought home 1 gold, 1 silver, and 5 bronze medals across all events.



The Games provided a critical development opportunity for the next wave of national-team talent, many of whom will transition toward national team pathways.

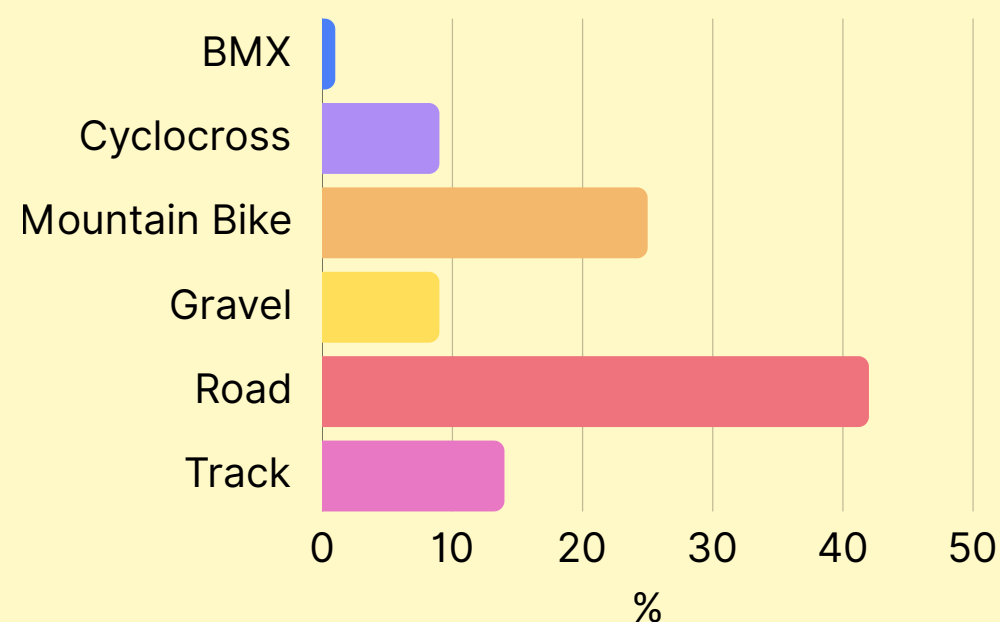

NEW Strategic Plan in Action

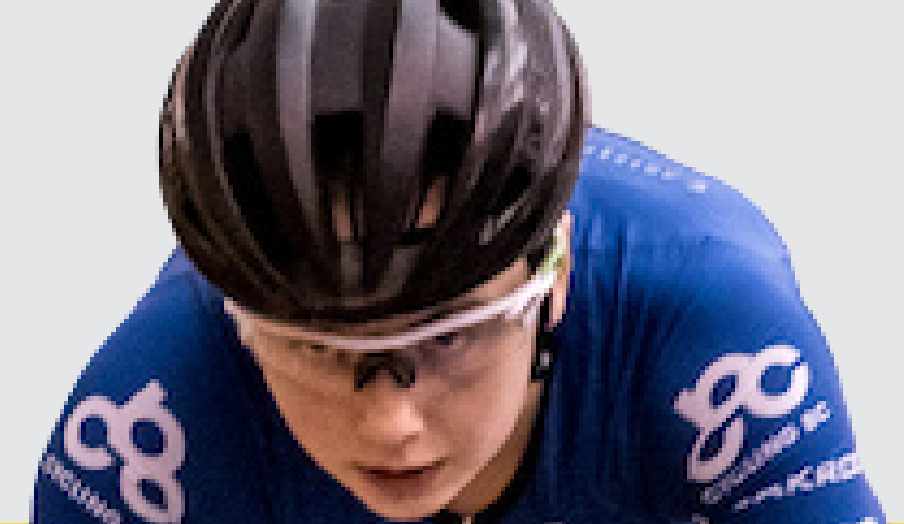
With the 2025–2028 Strategic Plan adopted, Cycling BC is now executing its operational work plans. Quarterly objectives tied to each strategic pillar are being tracked and reported to the Board—and, importantly, shared with the membership through our new quarterly report. These reports will be posted publicly so members can see how we are progressing on commitments related to our strategic initiatives.

NEW Executive Director Leadership

Our new Executive Director is already engaged with staff, board, and stakeholders to ensure that organizational priorities are clear, resourced, and moving forward. Their leadership will be instrumental in translating the strategic plan from paper to practice.

NEW Associate Director, Sport Performance, Coaching & Education

In 2026, Cycling BC will be hiring a new Associate Director focused on Sport Performance, Coaching, and Education. This role will consolidate and elevate our athlete development, coach certification, and education-delivery functions under one role—ensuring that athletes and coaches receive coordinated and consistent support.
